

- The completed online form should be submitted on or before the dates decided by the Institution/HP University Notifications.
- After the approval of admission form by the Admission Committee of the college, the selected candidates will have to submit the Fees and other dues online within the specified dates, failing which your admission for any Programme/Course will stand, cancelled.
- The admission will be purely provisional, and will be cancelled at any stage, if the information submitted online is found incorrect.
- The provisional admission will be finalized after the verification of the original documents/testimonials.

Ragging is a Criminal Offence

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be **reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti-ragging committee.** A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be **punishable with imprisonment for a term**, which may extend to **three years** or shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to **Rs. 50,000 or both**.

रैगिंग एक दंडनीय अपराध है। कॉलेज परिसर में सभी प्रकार की रैगिंग पर सख्ती से प्रतिबंध लगा दिया गया है। किसी को भी इस बुराई में पकड़े जाने पर कानून के तहत दंड दिया जाएगा। रैगिंग से सम्बंधित शिकायत या सुझाव कॉलेज अधिकारियों / एंटी रैगिंग समिति के सदस्यों को दे सकते हैं। जो छात्र रैगिंग का अपराध करता है उसे एक अवधि के लिए कारावास के साथ दंडित किया जा सकता है यह दंडतीन साल तक का भी हो सकता है साथ ही जुर्माना के लिए भी उत्तरदायी होगा, यह जुर्माने की राशि रूपए 50,000/- तक हो सकती है या दोनों भी हो सकते हैं।

Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh. Punishment for ragging includes:

- Imprisonment, fine or both.
- Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Withholding of results.
- Suspension of expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

College Profile







General Admission Rules

For admission to the 1st Year, a student must not be more than 23 Years (25 Years for girls) of age on 1st July 2022, e.g. the applicant should not be born earlier than 01/07/2000 in case of boys and 01/07/1998 in case of girls. However, in respect of SC and ST students a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The Vice-Chancellor of HPU Shimla has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases could provisionally be granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal and a consolidated list of such cases be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor. A candidate who has availed agerelaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsequent classes also.

Eligibility for Admission

The candidate should be passed in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H. P. University:

- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. / B.C.A. program.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with mathematics as one of the subjects shall be given preference in admission to B.C.A. program.
- Admission is purely on merit basis. Rounding of fraction of marks is permissible as per norms.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for Undergraduate (UG) Courses

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission for implementation of academic session 2022-23.

OUTLINES OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM:

Core Course: (12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.

Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE): (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: (2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication/Sanskrit.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

Reservation of Seats (Ordinance 3.14)

Our institution follows the reservation policy of H.P. Government and H.P. University in admissions. The following reservations are available, which are filled according to the reservation roaster devised by H.P. University:

Schedule Caste (SC): 15% Schedule Tribe (ST): 7.5% Sports (SP): 5% Cultural Activities (CUL): 5% Persons with disability (PC): 5%

These reservations will be applicable to those, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other Schools located within territorial Jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh. Sports and cultural quota will be applicable to those events which are recognized by HPU sports and co-curricular council. The final decision under sports and cultural quota will rest with the respective committees constituted for the same. For reservation, the following roster will be followed:

Examination & Evaluation System

The Evaluation System in CBCS will consist of two components:

- (i) Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE): Accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- (ii) End Term /Annual Examination (ETE): Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that a student's gets in a course.
- (I) Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE): This would have the following components:
- (a) Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures /Tutorials/ Practical's.
- **(b) House Exams/ Mid-Term Tests:** There will be one mid-term test of 15 marks. It is mandatory to appear in mid-term test & must score 45% marks to become eligible for end-term examination.

(c) Seminar / Assignment:

- (i) The 10 marks of the CCE will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.
- (ii) The remaining 5 marks of the CCE will be awarded on the basis of attendance.
- (iii) End-Term/Annual Examination (ETE): The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of end-term/ annual examination (ETE) that will be of three hours duration and covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Discipline and Conduct

The Principal has power to take disciplinary action against student indulging in acts of indiscipline, which may lead to fine, suspension, rustication or expulsion. The following activities will be considered as violative of the college discipline and may result in fine expulsion or rustication depending on the gravity of the offence:

- Violence, use of force and ragging.
- Making noise and disturbing classes.

- Breaking college furniture, doors, windows, etc.
- Bringing outsider to the college campus.
- Interfering with electrical wiring/appliances.
- Writing / defacing walls and blackboards.
- Eve-teasing
- Smoking, use of Gutka or any intoxicant.

Identity Card cum Library Card

Identity Card cum Library Card is an important document a student must carry every day. In case of loss of Card, an application to the Principal along with payment of Rs 20/- duplicate I-Card will be issued. I-Card cum Library Card should be collected from the Librarian as per schedule notified by the librarian.

College Library

The issuance of the books is between 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM on all working days. A student must bring his/her library card to get the books issued in his/her name. Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days. Reference Books/ Dictionaries/ Newspapers/ Periodicals will not be issued. If the issued books are not returned by due date, a fine at the rate of Rs. 1 per book per day will be charged. In case of a loss or damage of an issued book, it will either be replaced or its payment of the present cost will be accepted only with the permission of Principal.

Leave Rules

Students should get their leave applications recommended by the teachers.

- Leave for 2 days will be sanctioned by the senior tutors / subject teacher.
- Leave for 2-5 days will be sanctioned by the Vice-Principal.
- Leave for more than 5 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.

Re-admission

The students absent for **6 days continuously** from any class without proper sanctioning of leave by the competent authority of the college, his/ her name automatically will be struck off from the rolls. A student **absent for 10 days in a month** will also be deleted from rolls.

Re-admission will be entertained on payment of readmission fee of Rs. 100/-within 7 days after duly permitted by the Principal. After expiry of 7 days the student will have to bear a re-admission fee of Rs. 200/-. The recommendation of the teacher and in addition to it, the Principal may impose extra fine depending upon the gravity of his/her absence. A student struck off for the second time in a session from any class will be ineligible for re-admission to the class.

Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Activities

Education is a very broad term and goes beyond training of one's mind for acquiring textual knowledge. It is associated with other activities in order to see multi-dimensional development of overall personality of a man. The college provides opportunity to our students through many co-curricular and other activities that help them to develop into a sound body and mind. Keeping this in view we have societies like **Social Science Society**, **Red Ribbon Club and Eco Club etc**. Students are encouraged to join these societies as per their interest. Students can approach the incharge of these societies.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has two NSS units. Enrolment in NSS is done in the **beginning of the session in the month of August**. Students have to apply as and when notified through notice board for participation in NSS activities. Interested students may contact NSS Programme officers for enrolment.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college has two NCC wings separately for boys and girls and recruitment is done by selection. NCC teaches the students the lesson of study and discipline. A, B & C Certificates holder are eligible to appear directly for interview in the Armed Forces.

Rovers and Rangers

The college has got one unit of Rovers and Rangers each. Basically it is a voluntary non-political youth organization wherein students are trained to combat during natural disaster and otherwise too. It helps its members to have all-round development and become perfect responsible individuals to the society, nation and the world at large.

Note: The students can opt for either NCC or NSS or Rovers and Rangers.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The College Students Central Association is formed every year as per the rules laid down by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time. Presently the selection for various posts of this association is done through merit i.e. indirect selection mode.

Parent Teachers Association (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education Parent Teachers Association (PTA) under section 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education Code, 2001, has been established. It is a non-political body for better coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities of the college.

Sports

It is a bygone story that studies only bring name. Sports have taken many a stride where one can try for a name and fame. In order to encourage students our college provides facilities for indoor and outdoor games. Students are encouraged to participate in any of the games and prepare for inter-college tournaments organised by Himachal Pradesh University to earn name and fame and establish oneself in sports also. In addition, the college offers a well-equipped gym on campus.

Renuka Dhara: Yearly Periodical

In order to encourage creative abilities among the students, the college magazine 'Renuka Dhara' is published annually. It consists of a number of sections and each section has one staff editor & one student editor. Students are asked to contribute original authored poems, articles, stories, memoires, experiences, and so on giving it a literary tinge. It also exhibits a panoramic summary of year-long activities in the form of pictography.

Educational Tours

For the overall development of the student's stream-wise educational tours are arranged from time to time. The purpose of the trip is usually observation, non-experimental research or to provide students with experiences outside their everyday activities, such as going & camping with teachers and their classmates.

Annual Prize Distribution

Various awards and prizes are given to the meritorious students in **academics** and to those who **excel in sports and co-curricular activities** on the Annual Prize Distribution Function as per college norms.

Career Guidance & Counseling Cell

Career guidance cell guides the students regarding different career prospects open to them. Clippings of advertisements for different posts/training programs from various newspapers are also displayed on the notice board for the benefit of students. Sometimes, resource persons are also invited.

Mentor Cell

The Students are encouraged to interact with their teachers regarding their problems which may be academic, non-academic or personal. Appropriate help and guidance are provided to cater the needs of students. It is also an essential and integral part of IQAC.

Graduate Add-On Program

Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam (HPKVN) is implemented the Graduate Add-on Program in selected Colleges shared by Department of Higher Education. This training programme will train 2,000 students in selected sectors viz., BFSI, Electronics, IT-ITES, Beauty and Wellness, Apparel & Made Ups Sectors. Further, Indian Institute of Skill Development (IISD) has been selected to provide training in the aforesaid sectors in academic year 2022-23. The entire funding for the programme is being done by HPKVN with no cost to Directorate of Higher Education (DOHE).
